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Patterns containing larger pieces will need to be taped together before cutting out the fabric.



For 15.5" Gene Marshall

Basic Instructions

You will get the most professional results by following a few recommendations.

- Use a 1/4" seam allowance unless noted otherwise on the pattern piece or instructions. This seam allowance is already included in the dimensions of the pattern.
- Press the garment as you work through each step. Press seams open where applicable.
- In un-lined garments, finish raw edges with an over-lock or zigzag stitch.

Note that RST = Right Sides Together and WST = Wrong Sides Together.

Fabric and Notions

Dress: satin, silk, or similar, tulle, remnant chiffon & nylon for scarf and gloves

Lining: Poly or silk essence

Notions: doll zipper trimmed to approx. 4.5", satin rosette, matching thread,

Dress

- 1. RST, matching notches, sew dress side front sections to dress front section. Press the seams open.
- 2. RST, matching notches, sew dress side back sections to dress back sections. Press the seams open.
- 3. RST, sew the center back seam of the dress from the hem to the dot. (Back seam is ½").
- 4. Press the center back seam open. Pin zipper to opening and sew in place.
- 5. Sew the dress front and back together at the side seams. Clip seams and press open.
- 6. Check the fit to the doll. (Be careful not to pull the zipper pull off the zipper tape).
- 7. Repeat the above sewing steps for the dress lining.
- 8. Pin dress lining to dress and sew the hems together.
- 9. Push the lining into the dress and press the hem edge.
- 10. To finish the bodice edge, pull the lining up and rotate it 180 degrees.
- 11. With RST, pin the lining to the bodice with the lining matching up with the zipper on the left and right back openings.
- 12. Sew across the top of the bodice. Check both sides, then clip and trim the seam allowance.
- 13. Press the bust edge.
- 14. Hand finish dress lining to the zipper tape.
- 15. Cut two strips of tulle 6" x 36".
- 16. Stack the layers on top of each other and fold them in half lengthwise.
- 17. Run a gathering stitch along the folded edge.
- 18. Sew the layers together along the short end. Trim the seam.
- 19. Pull the gathers to fit the hem edge of the dress. (approximately 6")
- 20. Hand sew the tulle to the dress.
- 21. Fluff the layers by separating them.

Gloves (use a short stitch length with a slight zigzag).


- 1. Fold the upper edge of the sleeve under 1/4" and top stitch.
- 2. With the right sides together, fold each glove in half. Stitch around the outline leaving the top open.
- 3. Clip seams, turn right side out.

Scarf


1. Sew or serge a narrow hem around the entire scarf.
